As Richard stated "having a disability is not a limitation, it only makes life more interesting." Let's take his wise words and don't let any limitations get in our way.

Over the last few years, we have been given the opportunity to receive an education by a university classified as a "Research University with Very High Research Activity" by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching," one that is now ranked in the top 10 of the largest universities in the United States. Let's take the memory of this opportunity to make a lasting difference and to create a new world for our children and their children. The responsibility is ours, if we wish to truly make it so.
